The United Church of Christ Book of Worship has a section called "Order for Times of Passage: Farewell." The first paragraph says, "People experience periods in their lives which shape the future. The church celebrates and acknowledges the most familiar of those passage times – birth, marriage, death. There are other passage times in each of our lives. People leave the church to move to another community. Couples become engaged. A person secures a new job. [A minister retires and moves on.] These moments...can be deep and important spiritual experiences."

With the announcement of Howard's retirement we are faced with a passage, a transition. It means uncertainty and change. It brings with it all sorts of thoughts and emotions. We've been through these transitions in the Church or in our own lives before. The Church lives in these transitional times.

Scripture reminds us "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven..." (Ecclesiastes 3). This is a time to celebrate Howard's ministry over his entire life. Any loss brings grieving, and we must acknowledge that

we grieve differently, and make room for our varying expressions. This is a time to plan for the future of this church, and to take time to heal, to welcome the Holy Spirit for guidance, inspiration, and direction. This is the time to listen and to get the message.

So what's the message here for Glenview Community Church?

First, and foremost, is that GCC is God's church. It is not Howard's church. It is not Pam's church. It is not your church. It's God's church, and we're going to be okay. More than okay, because God is still speaking and God is in charge.

The message is that we are loved, and we will be taken care of by this compassionate God, and by one another. We need each other. May we come together. May we truly listen to one another. May we honestly address issues, concerns and lingering hurts among us. And may we continue to dream about God's church and what might be possible.

Let's be ready to get the message.

My Church, My Faith, My Commitment

We have come a long way but have not yet reached our goal of fully funding all budget requests. We ask that everyone, those who pledge and those who donate, to help us in this important effort to fully fund our church financial needs.

At the request of the Stewardship Board a letter was prepared by John Tillman with input from the Finance Board, Executive Board and in Howard's voice from his sermon "Enough". Howard approved this letter and agreed to sign each of the 500 letters and wrote personal notes on 200 letters. The pledge increase within a few weeks of this mailing is \$63,521.00 for those who already pledged. In addition over \$29,000 in pledges, which had not been received prior to our December Executive Board meeting, came in. The Stewardship Board wishes to thank Howard for his willingness to reach outside his comfort zone and his area of responsibility to assist the Stewardship Board in reaching out for additional funds to support the work of our church.

We are deeply grateful to everyone who responded to this letter and increased their pledge. Applause and appreciation is extended to each of you from the Executive Board for your amazing generosity.

The Stewardship Board has confidence yet more pledges and donations will arrive. We will report all additional pledges and donations to the Finance Board up to the date of our Mid Winter Meeting on February 13 with the hope that our congregation will fully fund all budget requests which at this time is approximately \$50,000.

From The Parish Nurse:

The Still Point

Stress is a fact of life. Although it may spur us on to meet deadlines, etc., it also may contribute to high blood pressure, heart attacks, gastric ulcers, anxiety, short tempers, depression, etc. Though we may never be able to escape stress, we may be able to reduce its negative consequences. I offer of finding your "still point," "that place of centeredness and calm that contributes to your physical, emotional, and spiritual wellness." This may help you find peace in the midst of the chaos of the day.

I know you're thinking that you don't have time, but I encourage you to try and find a few minutes. Its repetition may provide a welcome break from the pressures of daily life.

- Pick a word, phrase or short prayer that's comforting or reassuring to you
- Sit quietly with your back firmly supported and feet comfortably positioned
- Close your eyes

- Recognize any tension in your body.
 Acknowledge this tension, then let it go and relax
- Gradually slow and deepen your breathing. As you do, repeat your word, phrase or prayer
- If busy thoughts interrupt, don't resist them. Passively observe them and then return to the repetition
- Whenever you are ready, slowly open your eyes and savor this restful state a few minutes more

To achieve the maximum benefit from finding and enjoying your "still point," repeat it once or twice a day for 10 minutes at a time. When at work or under pressure, practice one to two minutes as often as needed. Let this ritual become an important part of your daily life.
