

Pilgrims Progress

In December when our granddaughter was born, Danita and Eric had not decided on a name for her. A couple of hours after her birth, they asked me about women's names in the New Testament and I mentioned Lydia. I gave them a brief sketch of her and they told me that was one of the three names they were considering. A few minutes later they asked me to step out of the room so they could discuss together what they wanted to name their daughter. A few minutes later they named their daughter Lydia Noel. I look forward to watching our granddaughter, Lydia, grow. I wonder what paths she will take. Will there be any parallels in her life to the life of this woman whose name she shares?

The Lydia that I told Danita and Eric about was a business woman and a seeker of faith. She was from Thyatira, a city in Lydia. Lydia may have gotten her name from her homeland. She may have been Sarah or Mary of Lydia, but in meeting, interacting with people, and people telling about her, Lydia became a nickname by which she was known. If we trace the family histories of many of the Smiths in this country, we learn that they worked as silver smiths, gold smiths, and black smiths. John the silver smith became known as John Smith. Something similar probably happened to Lydia.

Lydia owned a cloth shop in Philippi and sold purple cloth. Her native land of Lydia was on the seacoast. There was a particular shellfish that produced a secretion that was used as dye. This dye was purple in color and had to be collected drop by drop from the shellfish. A pound of wool dyed with this purple dye cost about \$60 in 50 CE. That was a lot of money in those days. Purple was the color of royalty and the color of wealth. Frankly, it was about the only color available in those days and only the wealthy could afford it.

Lydia was faithful in her relationship with God. Luke identified her as "a worshiper of God." That phrase could mean that she was a Jewess. Being a native of Thyatira, which had a Jewish community that settled there during or after the Babylonian exile, Lydia could have been from a Jewish family. Or Lydia may have been a Gentile convert to Judaism. Whatever path her faith had taken, Lydia was one of the women gathering down by the riverside to pray where she met the Apostle Paul (Acts 16:11-15).

By telling us about Lydia, Luke tells us a great deal about the early church. In this brief story, we are told that followers of the Way did things differently than was the custom, or according to culture, or according to tradition. Paul and Silas were Near-Eastern males talking to women in public. That was different. Twice in his Gospel Luke mentions women who followed Jesus from Galilee (Lk. 23:49. 55). Women are the first announcers of good news, who ran to tell the male disciples (who were hiding) that Jesus had risen from the dead (Lk. 24:9). Lydia was a founder of the church at Philippi (Acts 16:11-15). She opened her home to Paul and Silas and they stayed with her while they were in Philippi.

When Paul consented to stay in Lydia's home and receive her hospitality, many barriers fell. Barriers at the time divided male from female, divided Jew from Gentile, and even divided Jew from Gentile Jewish convert, but these barriers were removed in the early church. Lydia was a businesswoman who was open to God and was seeking more and more of God's love and grace in her life. I recommend Lydia to you as a fellow seeker in search of faith.



It's time to bake cookies for the Night Ministry. This year's Cookie Day is Valentine's Day Sunday. This is our 11th year of baking for this most worthy cause.

For our new members, or folks not familiar with the Night Ministry, this organization provides shelters for teen-agers and also runs a bus that serves homeless and street people 6 nights a week. Visitors to the bus come in for warmth, counseling, HIV testing, to visit with a nurse and always are given a hot beverage. As they leave the bus, they are given a package of 3 cookies (I think cookies mean somebody cares about you). On average they give away about I,000 cookies a week!

Our cookie gifts mean a great deal to the folks who visit the bus. Our church members bake the cookies and the PYF and 678 Club put them into packages of 3 and deliver them. This makes this an all church participating project.

You can never bake for a more worthy cause. Home-made cookies are always greatly appreciated, but if you were to buy coookies, OREOS are preferred.
