THE MEASURE OF OUR MINISTRY

On Sunday, February 23rd the congregation of the Glenview Community Church will gather for its Mid-Winter Meeting in the sanctuary immediately following worship. At that meeting we will be conducting several items of business.

ONE We will receive nominations for the offices of Clerk and Treasurer from the Leadership Committee. These two officers keep our church records in order and our church moving forward in an intentional and responsible way. Bob McGee has been our Clerk for several years and is invaluable to me and many others. More things than most of us know happen and happen smoothly at the Glenview Community Church because of Bob. We are indeed blessed that Bob has accepted the nomination of the Leadership Committee for another term as Clerk.

After a number of years of service as our Treasurer, Rob Hevey is retiring from this office. Rob has been invaluable to the financial stewardship of our congregation, and I am thankful for his steady leadership. In this office as well we are blessed that David Aki has accepted the nomination of the Leadership Committee for Treasurer. For both of these nominations I am grateful to our Leadership Committee and its chair, Vice Moderator Mike Lauesen.

TWO We will act on a recommendation to use a bequest as it has been directed by the donor's family for a new audio amplification and video capture system in the sanctuary. Through my beginning months at GCC, a number of you have expressed that you share this family's concern that it is often difficult or impossible to hear speakers in the sanctuary. The proposed system with its state-of-the-art technology will provide a vast improvement. This system will get us into the 21st century by not only

allowing us to hear, but by allowing us to share audio and video of worship and other events in the sanctuary through recordings, our website and web (YouTube and similar) channels. Having technology like this, and using it, is essential for sharing our ministry in and beyond the walls of our church building.

THREE We will receive and act on a proposed 2014 budget for the Glenview Community Church. Budgets serve various functions in households and organizations. Sometimes they are management tools. Sometimes they express financial commitments. I am convinced that a church budget is primarily a statement of our mission and ministry. In other words, in dollars and cents, a church budget sets the priorities for what we shall do in Jesus' name. As we receive and review the proposed 2014 budget for GCC on February 23rd, I invite you to try reading it as a statement of mission and ministry. I also invite you to view it as a plan to use our financial resources for the strength and growth of our congregation's future rather than as a plan to do tomorrow what we did yesterday. And, as you do that, I invite you to reflect on how you can personally better respond to God's love in your financial support for the ministries and mission of the Glenview Community Church. Yes, money is one measure of our ministry: the money we give in our faithful stewardship of the blessings we have each received from God, and then the money the Glenview Community Church uses in its faithful stewardship of the gifts that the congregation shares with this community of believers.

But even more important than these financial barometers is the spiritual barometer of this congregation. How are we sharing
