

PLANNING FOR LENT, HOLY WEEK AND EASTER

This issue of the Broadcaster lists worship and other events that are intended to provide a spiritually fulfilling experience of this holiest time of the church year. I thought that you might wish to have more information about some of the services.

ASH WEDNESDAY

This service at 7:30 p.m. on February 22nd will include the Litany of Confession from the Book of Worship of the United Church of Christ (UCC), sermon ("Being With Jesus During Lent") and Holy Communion and Imposition of Ashes. Although not widely used in the UCC, imposition of ashes is offered here as a sign of mortality and penitence, with ashes of burned palm fronds, mixed with olive oil, being transferred on the minister's thumb from a small bowl to the participant's forehead or back of a hand.

LENTEN GATHERINGS

On five Wednesday evenings, from February 29th to March 28th, we will gather at 5:45 p.m. for a light supper, followed by a half-hour Taizé service at 6:30 p.m. Taizé is a meditative prayer service that incorporates simple, repetitive song and chant, scripture readings and periods of group silence, allowing the mystery of God to become tangible through the beauty of simplicity. At 7:00 p.m. after the March 7th and 14th services, Allan Ruter will lead book discussions of the Scarlet Letter, by Nathaniel Hawthorne (1850).

MAUNDY THURSDAY

This service at 7:30 p.m. on April 5th will include sermon ("the Last Supper"), and Holy Communion and Order for Tenebrae. Maundy Thursday comes from the Latin mandatum novum, referring to the "new commandment," which Jesus taught his disciples (John 13:34 – "Just as I have loved you, you should love one another."). Tenebrae, the Latin term for "shadows," involves the scriptural readings describing Christ's passion, trial, and death, with a candle being extinguished after each reading. Then, after a reading from the Gospel of John ("The Word was God"), the Christ candle is extinguished, a noise is made to signify Christ's death, the altar is stripped, the Christ Candle is relighted as a symbolic promise of the resurrection, and all present leave the darkened church in silence.

GOOD FRIDAY

This service at 7:30 p.m. on April 6th will consist of "mini-sermons" focusing on the Seven Last Words of Christ on the cross, with five anthems being sung by our chancel choir, including Behold the Lamb of God (Handel), Crucifixus (Bach), and God So Loved the World (Stainer).

Our Lenten theme for Community Worship services is "*Healing Relationships*." At Family Worship on March 4th, our fourth graders will receive and read from their Bibles. Our Palm Sunday service on April 1st will include a Passion Play presented by our fifth graders. Finally, our two Easter services will be a joyful celebration of Christ's resurrection in words and music.


COMMON GROUND IN GLENVIEW
