

STRAINING FORWARD

On Sunday, February 23rd, the Epistle lesson that was read in worship is one that is particularly inspiring and challenging for me. It comes from chapter 3 of the Apostle Paul's letter to the church in Philippi:

Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

Following worship on that Sunday our congregation remained in the sanctuary for its Mid-Winter Meeting. As that meeting unfolded, it became more and more clear that it was living out the spirit of Paul's ancient words in the life and ministry of the Glenview Community Church!

- We re-elected Bob Mc Gee as our Clerk and elected Dave Aki as our Treasurer unanimously and with great thanks.
- We received the Clerk's, Treasurer's and Stewardship Board's excellent reports with appreciation.
- We heard a thorough and thoughtful presentation of the proposed budget for GCC's ministry and mission in 2014. After several questions from members of the congregation that were equally thoughtful and concerned about our ministry and mission, we approved the budget. And, by approving it, we committed to the justice of providing health insurance for all of our full-time staff.
- Finally, Mr. David Hecht, President of Sound Planning, Inc., presented a proposal for a new audio amplification and

video capture system for our sanctuary that will dramatically improve the intelligibility of the spoken word and allow us to present and record worship and other events in the sanctuary. To be funded by a directed bequest, this exciting project was approved and will be installed in the next months.

Both these specific decisions and the palpable presence of the Holy Spirit in the congregation's spirit witness that GCC is investing in the future of its ministry and mission: thankful for the richness of its past that lies behind, but focused on straining forward to what lies ahead for our future in God's grace.

As we strain forward, we have challenges. The budget we approved depends on \$130,000 for our ongoing ministries and on \$60,000 to support our Capital Reserve Fund from our unrestricted reserves that grew by more than \$1,000,000 in 2013 through beguests that we received. These bequests are an amazing blessing as we strain forward...as we strive to make our financial commitments equal to the financial needs of GCC's ministry and mission. As we strain forward, Sally Thuresson offered us a very specific challenge. She told us that, if we each added six dollars a week to our support of GCC, we would fully support our ministry and mission. Then she said that she would do just that.

As we approach the first anniversary of our ministry together on March 1st, the witness of our meeting and the spirit of this great congregation makes me feel incredibly blessed to serve as your Senior Pastor. Yes, we are straining forward!
