

Pilgrim's Progress

Pilgrim's Progress is the title of John Bunyan's classical allegorical work. It catalogs the journey of Christian, a man who is seeking his salvation on a pilgrimage to Heaven. Along the way, Christian encounters many obstacles that test his faith as well as many characters that are useful in showing him the difference between right and wrong, from the perspective of Christian religious faith. After Christian attains his heavenly reward, his family completes a pilgrimage to join him. Told as a dream, this seventeenth century religious classic uses Bible verses mixed with allegorical characters to preach its evangelist message.

Are we less prejudiced now than we were last year or have we only shifted our prejudices toward a different person or group? Have we expanded or reduced our relationships? Are we more inclusive or exclusive in our interactions with other

people? Are we more hospitable and welcoming now than we were in May 2009?

Periodically, it is helpful for us to explore our progress. Now may be that time for you. Having elected leaders at the Annual Congregational Meeting, this is an appropriate time to reflect on our progress as a congregation. How is your progress, my progress, our progress as pilgrims?

After 27 years of Good News Community Kitchen (GNCK), the board and staff have changed the name to A Just Harvest. What was once "just" a feeding program now includes advocacy and organizing work on behalf of the patrons; specifically, working to address the larger, systemic issues that create and sustain hunger and poverty in their neighborhood in the first place. In addition, they feel the new name will eliminate confusion with other "Good News" organizations located in their neighborhood, including Good news Community Church and Good News Partners.

Under the new name, A Just Harvest, there are two interrelated parts within the organization, both currently represented by volunteers in our church:

- The advocacy and organizing work, Northside P.O.W.E.R. (People Organized to Work, Educate and Restore)..... represented at GCC by Pam Riedy. Pam has been newly elected to serve on the board of A Just Harvest.
- The feeding program, The Kitchen or the Community Kitchen....represented by Sandra Frantz.

The Kitchen needs volunteers from GCC to serve dinner every month on the first Sunday and the third Wednesday. We are
