

WE WOULD BE BUILDING

This is the theme for our upcoming year of ministry together that will begin on **Rally Day**, September 9.

The obvious reference of this theme is our capital project. In this case, the theme might be better stated, **We Will Be Building**. Just now, all is quiet on the construction front at GCC. The asbestos abatement is complete. Full documentation for the building permit from the Village of Glenview was submitted on June 7. Unfortunately, the Village is taking longer than their promised schedule to respond to the documentation. This delay is very frustrating for GCC as well as for our construction manager. Our hope is that the permit will be issued so that construction can begin around August 1st.

But our theme is **WE WOULD BE BUILDING**. It is the title of a hymn text that was written by Professor Purd E. Dietz who served on the faculty of Eden Theological Seminary in the middle of the last century. The title that is our theme, is audacious. It indicates that we are taking on a monumental task. And it is aspirational. Our work of building the church is far more significant than anything we will ever accomplish with bricks and mortar.

One of the phrases that's gotten some attention around GCC is **New building, New church**. Perhaps a better way to state that is **Renewed building, Renewed church**. The point is that our building needs to be repaired, renovated and renewed for our contemporary culture and context...and so do our Message, Ministries, and Mission. task seriously. Here's a sobering statistic: when I was ordained in 1980, there were 1.7 million members in the United Church of Christ. At the end of 2017 there were 850,000. The UCC is half what it was. GCC has not experienced decline to that degree, but many congregations have experienced decline that outpaces the national statistics.

In my view, here are the transformations that we need to focus on if **we would be building** the church:

moving from institution to community... moving from minimum membership requirements to maximum discipleship risk...

moving from entertainment to meaning... moving from low commitment to high investment...

moving our expectations from being served to serving God... moving Sunday morning from passive spectators to engaged participants... moving from head to heart... moving from religion to faith... etc....etc....etc.

We Would Be Building. Please consider how you can join us in this audacious work that is before us: not with hammers, saws and nails...but with faith, hope and love. I always close with this: See you in church. But, more importantly, I pray that I will see the church in you!

SPIRITUAL COUNCIL MEETING REPORT MAY 15, 2018

At the May meeting, GCC's financial and spiritual outreach to the wider community were key topics. In addition, the Spiritual Council thanked outgoing Moderator Gretchen Grad for her tremendous service to the church during this year of transitions and hard decisions.

MISSION ALLOCATIONS:

The Spiritual Council approved the Mission Allocations Team's recommendation for dividing up GCC's annual mission budget. Because the total amount available for mission giving was reduced this year due to church budget considerations, the team was very selective in their review and reduced the number of recipients from 26 last year to 19 this year. The Mission Allocations Team made additional recommendations to divide the contents of a \$9,300 missions reserve fund to Heifer International and SERVV and to distribute \$3,700 donated in memory of Tom Lutz to Heifer International, Hands of Peace, A Just Harvest, and the Community Renewal Society. The Spiritual Council approved these recommendations.

SPIRITUAL HEALTH CENTER (SHC):

Founded by Bobbie McKay and her husband Lew Musil, the SHC is an independent nonprofit that offers research, books, and programs regarding Spiritual Life Teams. The Spiritual Council approved a motion to relocate the SCH from Bobbie's home to GCC. The move will carry no financial cost for GCC and should allow the organization to grow by providing a meeting space, making it easier to attract volunteers, and helping the group obtain grants. The move will also mesh with GCC's mission of outreach to the community.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Both revenues and expenses were ahead of budget for April, for a net \$42,000 performance favorable to budget year to date.

CONSTRUCTION REPORT:

Chuck noted that asbestos abatement has begun and emphasized that the contractor is carefully monitoring air quality in the building as the work progresses.

ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING REPORT MAY 20, 2018

At our Annual Meeting, the congregation elected members of the Spiritual Council and the Ministry Steering Groups, received annual reports from the Ministries and church leadership via the meeting packet, and heard updates about the construction work and other matters.

NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND MINISTRY STEERING GROUPS:

On the following page is a list of all Spiritual Council officers and Ministry Steering Group members. The names highlighted in bold were elected at the Annual Meeting.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE:

Nick Peters, Chair of the Construction Committee, explained the rigorous air testing process being carried out as part of the asbestos abatement project that began on May 7. He said that the Village of Glenview will probably issue the final construction permit by the end of July.

UPDATE FROM THE CONSTITUTION WORKING GROUP:

Bob McGee, Chair of the Constitution Working Group, reported that the CWG is about halfway through the process of addressing issues raised with the Interim Constitution and Bylaws. The CWG will present the proposed changes to the Constitution early in 2019 for review by the congregation and make a final set of revisions before the May 2019 Annual Meeting.

LETTERS TO THE CONGREGATION OF 5-16-18 FROM REV. PAM KECKLER, REV. CHUCK MIZE, AND MODERATOR GRETCHEN GRAD:

Jane Hund and Pam Keckler addressed the congregation regarding Pam's move to a part-time schedule and her upcoming retirement. Jane emphasized that the decisions about Pam's status have been painful, that GCC has had deficit budgets for 6 years, and that our reserves have been substantially reduced by the deficit spending. She also discussed the pressing need to engage members who are not pledging and not involved with the church, as well as to bring in new members from the community, in order to bolster GCC's vitality and financial health. Pam stressed that she will continue to do the same excellent work as long as she a pastor at GCC. In the fall, she will inform everyone about what her hours will be during her half-time phase. Pam's remarks were followed by questions and comments from the congregation.

SPIRITUAL COUNCIL MEETING REPORT JUNE 26, 2018

The theme of the June meeting was wrapping up the old church year and looking ahead to 2018–2019.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE:

Asbestos abatement has been completed, and the Village of Glenview is in the process of reviewing the permit for the principal construction project. Our contractor expects to begin construction in mid-July.

PASTORS' REPORTS:

Elizabeth reported on a successful Mission Trip and said that this year's group displayed exceptional unity and cohesion. She also said that the new crop of freshmen proved to be very active and engaged—a force of their own. Pam mentioned that in June she fulfilled a long-cherished wish to perform a wedding at Brookfield Zoo. She also attended the Illinois Conference of the UCC Annual Meeting and joined Chapter 3 of the Women's Association for a book discussion. Chuck said he has been working on ways to keep the building available while parts are closed for construction and with our reduced facilities staff. He also commented on assisting families in the congregation during times of loss and what a gift it is to be able to connect with these families.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The budget is roughly on target for 2018, running \$11,000 ahead of expectations year to date. Forward in Faith has a balance of about \$1.25 million to apply toward construction.

MINISTRY REPORTS:

The Ministries and Teams are currently in the planning phases for the events of the 2018–2019 church year. The Outreach Ministry reported on the ongoing Member Engagement project to clarify GCC's membership rolls by reaching out to contact members who have been inactive and determine whether they wish to remain inactive. Outreach is also seeking to increase GCC's visibility to the broader community this summer by planning events such as having a booth at the Glenview Summerfest street fair.

GIVING GLIMPSE JUNE 2018

The Message, Ministries and Mission of Glenview Community Church thrive because you fulfill your stewardship commitments and make faithful contributions. It is essential that we remain current in our giving and ensure the fiscal health of the church. In the midst of our busy lives, we offer you this update reminder to keep in focus our progress on completing our financial commitments to GCC. SUMMARY: We are \$24,098 better than budget through May. Our approved budget defines an annual deficit of \$79,779, so if the balance of the year holds plan, we will end 2018 with an operating deficit of \$55,681.


