CAPITAL TASK FORCE

UPDATE

Several months ago, the Spiritual Council affirmed the Capital Task Force's recommendation that The Kubala Washatko Architects, Inc. be retained to develop a Master Plan to update and improve the church facility's infrastructure, functionality, accessibility and aesthetics.

Since then, the Capital Task Force has solicited your ideas and worked with TKWA to gather information from all User Groups within the church: board chairs or their representatives, church officers and staff, and our ministries which include: GCCNS, Hands of Peace, A Just Harvest, the Resale Shop, Pageant, Boy Scouts and FIAT (Faith in Action Team).

On August 30, Vince Micha of TKWA presented the "Nearly Completed" Patterns (optimal ways for our facility to best serve our ministries) to the congregation. Each pattern documented a single problem or issue and identified the best solution. Copies of the 20 Patterns are available in the church office.

TKWA will be presenting the first draft of the Master Plan to the User Groups in the next few weeks. Later in the fall, after the plan is completed and costs are estimated, the congregation will have the opportunity to attend presentations to see the Master Plan, provide input, help prioritize the components of the plan and ask questions. The completed Master Plan will be presented to the congregation on Sunday, January 17, 2016, with Sunday, January 31, 2016 for a Special Congregational Meeting to authorize a Capital Campaign to fund the work set forth in the Master Plan.

Together, we are developing a vision for our church that will enable us to sustain and grow the Message, Ministries and Mission of Glenview Community Church into the 21st Century. Stay tuned as the excitement builds!

OCTOBER 14 No Longer a Pariah?

Our speaker Ahmed Sadri, a native of Iran and an American citizen, is a professor in the sociology department of Lake Forest College. The historic Nuclear Agreement reached between Iran and the P5+1 on July 14, 2015 was ground-breaking. It promises to cause a paradigm shift in the Iran/US relations and a realignment of regional alliances of the United States and Iran. We will explore the historical roots of the 12-year nuclear negotiations and reflect on their farreaching social and political consequences.

Professor Sadri was imprisoned for four months by the Iran government in 2014. He was arrested at the airport when returning to the US after visiting his family. He was eventually released and able to return to Chicago in December of last year. He is extremely knowledgeable and able to give an inside look at Iran.

NOVEMBER 18 Praise Be to You

John Wasik will be discussing Pope Francis's recent encyclical, 'Laudato Si' (*Praise Be to You*), and why it matters to everyone on the planet. Francis calls for an "integral ecology," a moral transformation linking the economics, the environment, social justice and spirituality.

The Faith In Action Team, like many of you, has been overwhelmed, saddened and stunned by the violent tragedies that have racial implications and overtones that have unfolded in various cities, including Chicago, during the past year. The United Church of Christ is committed to helping UCC churches do just that and has written the following passage, which we encourage GCC members to consider in their own lives:

O God, as people of faith, we agree to:

- 1. Become better-informed about people of other races so that we may overcome any fears and misconceptions that exist;
- 2. Consider how issues of racial prejudice and privilege affect each person with whom we come in contact;
- 3. Discover and acknowledge practices and structures that are racist in our churches, our communities and beyond;
- 4. Work to erase racism and injustice where they exist -- in ourselves, our church, our communities and beyond;
- 5. Heed Your call to embrace with love all people in all colors, races and faiths.
