She's no stranger to us. Fifteen years ago she joined the Glenview Community Church and seven years ago she joined our ministry staff. But last Sunday, Elizabeth Hartung-Ciccolini and GCC chose to begin a new journey together. In an overwhelmingly affirmative vote, we established the position of Associate Pastor for Youth and Children, and we called Elizabeth to that pastorate. In the next months, Elizabeth will complete the requirements for ordination in the United Church of Christ through the Chicago Metropolitan Association. Then, sometime next year, we will be blessed to celebrate Elizabeth's ordination to the Christian ministry in a glorious worship service at GCC. Then we will officially begin this journey of pastor and people together.

Even more amazing than the vote at the special congregational meeting on September 21st were the heartfelt witnesses of so many of our members. Through tears, we heard powerful testimonies to how Elizabeth has revitalized the youth ministry of our church...of how she has renewed the children's ministry of our church...of how she loves and cares for our children in tender, beautiful and trusting ways...of how she has touched the lives of our youth and led them through difficult times into the passion and promise of our faith.

It was simply thrilling to be with this congregation in the sanctuary for this special congregational meeting. The Holy Spirit was palpably and persuasively present in the room: in the speakers...in the listeners...in the energy that surrounded us. I am deeply moved and profoundly grateful.

The theme of our stewardship campaign to invigorate the message, ministries and mission of this *House for All God's People* September 24, 2014

is **Blessed to be a Blessing**. How blessed we are by Elizabeth and her ministry among us! How blessed we are by the youth of this church and their vital spirituality! How blessed we are by our spontaneous children and their dedicated families! We are so blessed!

And we are so blessed so that we can be a blessing to others. When God called Abram to become the patriarch of God's people, these are the words that God used:

Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

God didn't tell Abram where he would be going...but God did promise to guide Abram and to be with him every step of the way. God didn't bless Abram so that Abram could luxuriate in an elegant exclusivity... but God did command Abram to be a blessing for all the families of the earth.

Friends, it's no different for us than it was for Abram. God calls us to go where God leads us...trusting not the destination but the Guide. God blesses us with an amazing abundance...not so that we can possess great riches but so that we can richly bless others. For this journey we have decided that we and Elizabeth will be partners in Christ's service. This decision will stretch our already underfunded budget by another \$22,000. Because of that, it's tempting to say that we won't go...that we'll trust the small security of the status quo...that

THE SUMMER OF THE MUSIC LIBRARIES

Did you know that GCC has four separate music libraries? This summer we took on the monumental task of moving things from boxes and piles to files and databases. Here is where we stand on our vast and valuable collections:

CHANCEL CHOIR LIBRARY *Librarian: Pieter Fockens*

Pieter has kept this library organized for over 30 years (yes, you may applaud now). Everything is in a database and filed in cabinets on the stage and in the choir room.

CLONTS MEMORIAL LIBRARY (A RESERVE LIBRARY)

Librarians: Stephen Blackwelder, Pieter Fockens, Tricia Melzer-Swaydrak, Bill Cooper & Sheryl Long

Our newest library, this vast collection has everything from duets to choruses, sacred to secular, opera to jazz. 800+ titles were organized and put into a database. They remain in boxes until we can find adequate storage for them. There are thousands more titles to go, which are housed in file cabinets in the bell room. We anticipate another 2-3 years for this project.

INSTRUMENTAL LIBRARY *Librarian: Sue Cunningham*

Some of this library has been housed in piles stuffed in the back of file cabinets for many years, resulting in tattered edges and some minor damage to some of the scores. Our oversized scores have now been organized into folios, and our growing instrumental library – a result of the Pilgrim Wind Quartet wishing to play more often, and our growing excitement among all of our volunteer instrumentalists – was catalogued over the summer by Sue. Additionally, there are many choir anthems which have instrumental parts that have never been catalogued. The database should be completed sometime this fall.

HANDBELL LIBRARY

Librarians: Bonnie Dohring & Jan Gode Bonnie began the work of cataloguing our music a few years ago and Jan has continued it. Everything is in a database and filed in cabinets in the bell room.

WESTEND GOSPEL SINGERS FROM GERMANY

The Simple Gifts Concert Series of the Glenview Community Church presents Westend Gospel Singers from Eberwalde, Germany on Sunday, September 28 at 4:00 p.m. The Westend Gospel Singers began as a community choir at the Evangelical Church of Peace in Eberwalde, Germany in 1996 when Pastor Hanns-Peter Giering and his wife, Karin, put an ad in the local paper asking "Who wants to sing Gospel music with us?" The choir seeks to recreate the joy of Black American Gospel music and encourages everyone to sing along. For many members this is their first choir experience. Many classical composers came from Germany: Bach, Handel, Mozart, Hadyn. But in recent years gospel music has greatly enriched the music of the national church. Gospel choirs have developed in congregations all over Germany.

Now the choir returns to the United States for its third tour. The 35 member choir will tour Wisconsin UCC churches from September 30 – 25, finishing their tour with singing engagements at Trinity UCC in Chicago and The Glenview Community Church on Sunday, September 28th. The tour is a joint ministry of the Wisconsin Conference, United Church of Christ, and the German Evangelical Church of Berlin-Brandenburg-Schlesische-Oberlausitz.

The Westend Singers will present an exciting program including arrangements by Robert Robinson and Robert Ray, with a cameo appearance by GCC's Chancel Choir. A free will offering will be taken after the concert.
