

## **Pilgrim's Progress**

Members have strong reactions to the decision by the congregation on September 27th to vacate the position Minister for Mission and Ministry due to a projected deficit for 2010. People have expressed strong feelings on both sides of this decision. Some are convinced that this was the decision the congregation had to make. Others are convinced that this was a premature decision. Some have expressed delight in the decision. Others have expressed deep hurt and anguish in the decision. Some are pleased that the congregation made this decision. Others are ashamed of the decision that we made.

The gamut of feelings being experienced and expressed clearly indicate that we are in the midst of a very difficult time in the life of Glenview Community Church. You have heard it said or perhaps have said yourself, "Time heals." That is not true. Time only passes. What we do in the passing of time may heal or hurt. May all of us find healing things to do and say in the passing of time.

You will find it helpful to identify your feelings and talk about them with someone, perhaps a friend or colleague. Several have sought out Pam, Sally, Marilyn, or me to talk about their feelings and reactions to the decision and the impact it is having on them and on the congregation. Others may want to do that. Please contact us. We will do our best to help you process your feelings and experience healing. We also are exploring some additional ways that may be helpful in dealing with struggles that people have. We may offer opportunities in the future for the community to talk, listen, pray, and identify other resources that may be helpful.

Sally is continuing her ministry with us until December 31, 2009. We are fortunate that she is able and willing to stay with us until the end of the year. I encourage you to take advantage of the time available to communicate with Sally. You may want to talk with her in person, write her a letter, have coffee

with her, send her an email or give her a call on the phone. She will benefit from hearing from you and you will benefit from your interaction with Sally. A relationship is ending that has grown and evolved over the last six years. Acknowledging and dealing with our loss will help us as we grieve the ending of this relationship.


