FORWARD IN FAITH

It began because of the very practical concerns for our aging and failing building. This building, built in four stages over the thirteen years between 1946 and 1959, grew with an emphasis on affordability rather than elegance, and with the urgency of adequate space to house the ministry of this community that was exploding with growth in the 1940s and 1950s. Our forbears raised up a thrifty building of wood and brick; not a soaring cathedral of stone and stained glass. Yet, in its simplicity, there is a utilitarian elegance that has served this congregation and enabled us to serve God well.

Then we began to dream about what more this building could do and be for our ministry: better accessibility, sanctuary level accessible rest rooms, open and inviting spaces instead of narrow halls connecting box-like rooms, and inviting gathering spaces with multiple uses. In conversation with our members a master plan was developed by The Kubala Washatko Architects (TKWA).

Since June, we've been working diligently to elicit the financial resources from you that will renew our building. With the services of Havey & Associates, Inc. and the tireless leadership of Campaign Coordinators Karen and Tom Aldrich and many team members, the campaign has progressed. On Reformation Sunday, October 30, I shared an interim report on Forward in Faith with the congregation.

With 243 pledges to date, Forward in Faith has raised more capital funds than any other campaign in GCC's 75 year history...and we still are inviting responses from 130 households! The pledge amounts range from a low of \$10 to a high of \$300,000. And the total as of this writing is \$3,739,000. What an amazing response! Please see the article on the next page for the names of those who have contributed to date. If your name is on the list, thank you for your faithful and sacrificial support of the future of the Message, Ministries and Mission of Glenview Community Church! Next steps will include forming a Construction Committee and engaging TKWA (our architects), Pepper Construction (our construction manager) and Jerry Auliso of the AT Group (our owner's representative) toward developing a feasible design for input and review from the congregation. At this resting place along the way I am so grateful for your response to this campaign; for your investment in GCC's future as we make the love of God real and relevant together in our world and in human hearts today. Stay tuned...and I'll see you in church!

REPORT FROM THE SPIRITUAL COUNCIL

The Forward in Faith (Capital) Campaign, next steps on restoring and upgrading the GCC building, and Spiritual Life teams were key items of discussion at the Spiritual Council meeting on October 25.

Now that the approximate budget for building improvements is known, Pastor Chuck Mize reported that a building committee of members of the congregation will be needed to work with the architects to develop realistic building alternatives for consideration by the entire congregation. This process may take several months. Congregation members willing to serve GCC on this committee should contact Pastor Mize or Nancy Mullarkey. Pastor Mize also announced the selection of Jerry

Aulio of the AT Group to fulfill the role of owner's rep. Last spring the Spiritual Council authorized this position to consult with the architects and construction company to improve cost effectiveness and efficiency in choices of materials, design, and processes. Jerry is an architect by training and recently represented the Glenview Park District in its renovation and construction of the facility on Glenview Road.

Reverend Bobbie McKay reported that in the year since the first Spiritual Life Team first met, the program has now grown to eight teams, including one team charged with the goal of helping Bobbie dream and plan for future teams, of which there are six under consideration for 2017-18.

IN THE FINANCE BOARD

In the Finance Board report on the budget process, Dave Aki encouraged board chairs to use a zero-based budgeting approach to developing their plans for 2017-18, developing funding requests based on supporting the activities that are most closely related to the mission of the church. The Council also heard reports on the stewardship campaign and the Leadership Committee.

The next Spiritual Council meeting will be on November 15 in the Mayflower Room at 7:00 p.m. All church members are welcome to attend these meetings and to pick up meeting materials in the Church office the Sunday before the meeting.
