
The Israel trip included a visit and lunch with Daoud Nassar at his Tent of Nations (TON), on the farm in Palestine that his grandfather bought in 1916. The TON motto, "We refuse to be enemies," reflects Daoud's commitment to live out his Christian faith by loving his neighbors in the face of relentless harassment from the Israeli government, which wants his west bank land for expansion of the settlements that already bracket it on two sides.

Daoud brings together people from many different countries and cultures to build bridges of understanding, reconciliation, and peace. The long-term goal of TON is to prepare youth to make positive contributions to their future and society through the values of understanding, tolerance and respectful coexistence.

The farmland is under threat of confiscation by the Israeli military, and just before harvest last spring, the military bulldozed 300 fruit trees and the terraces on which they were planted. This is just the most recent outrage visited on Daoud, his family and the farm to which he has documented title. Purchasing a tree will help to re-plant the destroyed orchard and strengthen Daoud's claim to the land by restoring it to productivity.

GLENVIEW COMMUNITY CHURCH POSITION DESCRIPTION – FACILITY MANAGER

OVERVIEW:

Glenview Community Church is a 1,300 member congregation and is affiliated with the United Church of Christ. The church also operates a nationally accredited nursery school program.

In order to preserve a welcoming and safe environment, Glenview Community Church is seeking a Facility Manager to maintain the building and grounds by performing and supervising HVAC, electrical, plumbing, environmental, safety/security including custodial operations. The successful candidate shall possess excellent communication and interpersonal skills, with the ability to consistently improve overall facility operation.

ACCOUNTABILITY:

The Facility Manager reports directly to the Senior Pastor and will be a member of the church ministry support staff. This is a full time exempt position.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Responsible for the maintenance and operation of a 60,000 square foot facility plus grounds.
- Support and enable the many ministries of the Glenview Community Church.
- Relate to members and friends of the church in helpful and caring ways.
- Oversee and perform work related to HVAC operation including automation system, electrical, plumbing, custodial, painting, snow removal and building security.
- Monitor and perform all set-ups and take down of spaces as required for worship services, meetings, weddings, funerals, nursery school functions and other special events as needed.
- Establish and maintain a collaborative working relationship with outside vendors and suppliers.
- Ensure proper completion of daily, weekly, monthly and annual preventative maintenance tasks to building and grounds as required, in compliance with all building, fire and environmental codes.
- Attend monthly Properties Board meetings, providing a brief overview of building issues and any items which the Board needs to be aware of.
- Serve as the primary contact for facility related emergencies including any alarm calls which may require after-hour and /or weekend response.
- Fulfill any other duties or responsibilities that may be assigned by the Senior Pastor.

OPERATIONS:

- Conduct a daily checklist inspection of facility and grounds to identify potential maintenance, custodial, safety and security issues
- Maintain facility and grounds in a clean, organized appearance including all nursery school spaces.
- Perform maintenance tasks within limits of personal skills.

JOB DESCRIPTION - FACILITY MANAGER

- Schedule necessary repairs and inspections as needed, ensuring quality work at competitive pricing confirmed through like bids/proposals.
- Keep on hand sufficient inventory of all custodial and maintenance supplies needed for proper facility operation.
- Assure that all maintenance and custodial spaces are maintained in a safe and clean manner.
- Maintain, in an organized manner, all building maintenance re-

- cords, construction plans and documents along with all service contracts.
- Keep all MSDS/GHS documentation up to date as well as following all OSHA workplace guidelines.
- Assign daily tasks to facility staff and make periodic inspection of custodial work completed.
- Hold monthly facility team meetings with written minutes of items reviewed to be submitted to the Senior Pastor.
- Perform annual written performance review of facility staff members as directed by the Senior Pastor.
- Review and approve weekly time sheets of facilities staff members.
- Implement protocol for the proper handling, storage and disposal of any hazardous materials.
- Assist in the development of the annual budget related to facility operation and capital projects as required.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- The successful candidate will possess a minimum of a high school diploma with related trade school experience though a college degree is preferred. Previous facility management experience a plus.
- Must have a thorough understanding of building construction and property management with the ability to read, interpret and understand construction drawings and specifications.
- Promote and maintain a positive attitude along with a solution based approach with staff, church members and all groups utilizing the church facility.
- This position requires a high level of organizational skill with the ability to successfully manage multiple tasks to completion and meeting required deadlines utilizing sound decision making skills.
- The person filling this position must have the ability to climb ladders and scaffolds as needed as well as be able to push, pull, lift, (up to 75 lbs.) carry, reach, stand, sit, lean and walk including stooping and kneeling for long periods of time.
 Position requires being able to work outside as needed, both winter and summer in potentially extreme conditions.
- Schedule may include working evenings and weekends as required to meet the needs of the pastoral and ministerial team including Christmas Eve, Easter and special services as required.
