

ADVENT

Do you remember the days when radios and TVs had to be warmed up? Their electronic wizardry was not accomplished by miniaturized, digitized technology. Instead, it was accomplished by distinct components soldered together: capacitors, coils, resistors, diodes, potentiometers, transformers and vacuum tubes. It's the vacuum tube portion of that circuitry that had to warm up: evacuated glass envelopes that were heated by a little coil inside until they glowed, coaxing the electrons to flow in the right direction. It took several minutes for those tubes to reach operating temperature...and the heat that early color TVs radiated from their dozens of vacuum tubes could have warmed a can of soup for our lunch!

The point is that we had to wait. Then the miracle of transistors...then integrated circuits sent vacuum tubes packing. This new solid state technology was cool (in more ways than one!) because it didn't need to warm up. Waiting was a thing of the past.

Then came the personal computer revolution, and we started waiting again: this time not for these machines to warm up but to boot up. So we learned to wait all over again...not only for our computers to be ready, but for our processors, the internet and our cell phones to respond. With technology, speed is king...and I can hardly wait until my cell phone contract expires so I, too, can own the latest personal communication device equipped with 4G LTE technology.

Waiting. We wait for technology...for the physician...for a train...for traffic...for a sales associate...for our car to be repaired... for our favorite sports team to win...and for Christmas. We even build rooms for waiting, and equip them with magazines, and newspapers, and hot drinks, and bottled

water, and snacks, and a TV to help pass the time while we wait. In this sense, waiting is passive. It's non-productive. It's an albatross on our aggressive schedules. It's killing time.

The name of this season is Waiting. In the church we call it Advent. And, for our faith, it's meant to be very active. Our Advent waiting is active in two ways. First, it is active in its patience. Active waiting for God and for God's promises to be fulfilled means never giving up, never giving in, never compromising, never settling for anything less than peace with justice and mercy with healing for all of God's children. With God there is no gospel of good enough. Advent means never giving up on God and holding God accountable to bring to birth the perfection of love. Second, Advent waiting is active in its persistence. Waiting means participating in the fulfillment of God's promises through the ways we choose to live, and to give, and to work for, and to share God's good news. That means that Advent raises a sweat. It also means that we find joy in the waiting, not in some distantly anticipated reward.

So let us wait...remembering that Jesus is born in Bethlehem...believing that Jesus will be born in us and live through us... trusting that today is blessed because tomorrow is secure in God's love. It's Advent. Let's get our hands dirty in the waiting. See you in church!



CHRISTMAS OFFERING

This years Christmas Offering will support area homeless people in our local communities. Mary and Joseph sheltered in a stable in Bethlehem on the first Christmas Eve. Commemorate that event and help local people in need of shelter with your Christmas offering. Collections in specially marked Christmas envelopes or checks payable to GCC with the memo "Christmas Offering" will be divided equally between two organizations that support the homeless: Connections for the Homeless and Journeys The Road Home (formerly PADS.) There are more than 3000 cases of homelessness in suburban Cook County. In the Northwest suburbs alone, there are 1,200 homeless people accessing shelters with approximately 400 additional homeless people residing on the streets, in cars and throughout forest preserves.

Connections for the Homeless works to end homelessness by preventing people from losing their homes, re-housing those who already have, and helping each person to reach the greatest possible level of selfsufficiency. By helping people to remain housed, independent, and self-sufficient, Connections improves the quality of life both for those people and for the surrounding community. More than 800 volunteers are an integral part of this mission, supporting staff in their efforts, forming positive connections with program participants, and promoting a more accurate understanding of homelessness in the community.

Based in Evanston, Connections' reach extends across the North Shore and beyond to 31 communities throughout northern Cook County. The more than 1,000 clients of Connections' housing, employment and health services include people who were formerly incarcerated or suffer from mental illness, substance abuse and addictions. More than 50 churches and synagogues and dozens of community organizations partner with Connections to ensure a full range of services to clients. Learn more at www.cfthinc.org/wordpress.

Journeys is a collaborative effort between the HOPE Center and PADS shelter sites focusing on intervention and prevention for those in need. The clinical staff at the HOPE Center provide a wide array of psychological services, including mental health counseling, vocational rehabilitation, and housing assistance, all geared to helping their constituents achieve independence. Along the way, 19 faith-based emergency shelter sites provide dinners and a safe, warm place to sleep from October through April.

During the 2010-2011 fiscal year Journeys served 1,136 clients through the HOPE Center and PADS sites. The HOPE Center delivered over 26,457 services, and the PADS sites hosted 13,878 overnight stays and served 41,232 meals. The combined efforts of staff and volunteers were successful in transitioning 74 clients out of homelessness and preventing 688 clients from becoming homeless during this past fiscal year. Journeys employees are assisted by a pool of 2,500 volunteers who put in over 75,000 hours a year at the HOPE Center and PADS sites.
