

THE BEARD

One of my highest honors as the Senior Pastor of Glenview Community Church came in the weeks leading up to *The Nativity* (our hallmark Christmas Pageant) in 2014, when Pageant Director Beth Raebel asked me if I would consider participating in the Pageant by taking on the role of *Isaiah*, the Ancient **Shepherd**, at one of the two Pageant presentations. I was thrilled, and immediately said YES! And, every year since, I have been asked to reprise that role. So I have become **Isaiah, the Ancient Shepherd** four times. And I hope that I have done a credible enough job that I will be asked again... and again! I'm guessing that my part in the Pageant makes me unique in the Pageant's history. I don't think that any other Senior Pastor has taken on a role in this incarnation drama, and I don't think that anyone has repeated the same role four times. What a blessing!

But, there's one thing about being *Isaiah*, *the Ancient Shepherd* that's not a blessing! Four years ago when I first assumed this role I was escorted into the Founders Room for my make-up and costume. **Dick Mann** is my make-up artist. I applied the first coat of pasty gray to my arms, hands, neck and face. Dick refined this transformation that makes me look very ancient (if not half dead!) with more pasty gray and dark eye shadow. Then he glued a very bushy gray moustache and beard on my face.

The beard pulled off easily, and the makeup and the glue washed away in a hot shower...or so I thought! Last Spring I finally connected the dots and realized that the skin rash that I experienced in my temples for months after the Pageant was an allergic reaction to the latex beard glue. This year I explained the situation to Pageant Director **CJ Sultz** and asked her if I could grow my own beard. She agreed. So, if you've been wondering why my face has been getting increasingly fuzzy, now you know!

I wasn't expecting how itchy the process of growing a wizened beard would be. And, even though it did grow beyond the itchy stage, my plan was to shave it off on Pageant afternoon. But then a strange thing happened. A number of you commented positively on my beard. *It looks good!* you said. I'm enjoying it, too. And, after all, I'm kind of attached to it! So it didn't come off on Pageant afternoon.

Never fear: it will be gone by the new year. But, just now, I'm reluctant to let it go. And it's changed my perspective, if only in a small way. I look different. And sometimes looking different helps us to see ourselves and others in new ways.

Thats what Advent is all about: a season of preparation and expectation that helps us to see ourselves and others in new ways... in the ways of hope, peace, joy, and love...in the ways of Jesus who is born in Bethlehem.

For me, this beard that belongs to *Isaiah*, *the Ancient Shepherd* is a surprising blessing. My prayer is that God will give you surprising blessings this Advent...the blessings of new perspectives...the perspectives of hope, peace, joy, and love...the perspective of Jesus Christ our Lord. I wouldn't have received this unexpected blessing without Glenview Community Church. Perhaps God is waiting to surprise you, too, with unex-

construction committee: We have completed the Schematic Design phase and are moving into Design Development. The architects have been working hard to keep the cost estimates within our pledged funds. In January, the Construction Committee will hold an informational session for the congregation, in which they will present the latest plans and status of the project. In the meantime, the GCC website has a link to a folder with updates on the Construction Committee's progress.

MINISTRY REPORTS: The Ministries are bringing tremendous energy and creativity to all their areas of endeavor. The Outreach Ministry reported that around 125 members attended the Feed My Starving Children event in November. The Congregational Life Ministry is planning several exciting Fellowship events and invites leaders and volunteers to help out. The Women's Association is donating \$32,000 in funds from the Resale Shop to selected social service agencies and will donate further funds in spring. The Resource Ministry reported that the Generosity campaign is in full swing and has received nearly \$800,000 in pledges, working toward our goal of \$1 million.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Our pledge fulfillment continues to be behind budget, at about \$2,500 for the year to date. Our expenses are favorable to budget, but we are still in a deficit position and relying on reserve funds.

PASTORS' REPORTS: Pam, Chuck, and Elizabeth each related encounters in which they assisted people from outside the church in their capacity as pastors. They remarked that being open to serving someone outside the immediate GCC community allowed them not only to be true to God's mission but also to interact with special people in a meaningful way.

tion YOUR CHRISTMAS GIFT

This year's **Outreach Ministry** will be sharing the Christmas Gift with three of its benevolent organizations; **By The Hand, San Lucas UCC** and **The Northfield Township Food Pantry**.

By The Hand is committed to serving children from the most under-resourced, dangerous neighborhoods. We work closely with school principals to identify those who are most likely to drop out—those who are failing and in critical need of intervention. Typically, they are not meeting reading standards and they often have significant hardships that require special attention to overcome. It is our vision to help each one of these children experience a better life.

The Northfield Township Food Pantry was started close to 50 years ago and today, many hundreds of Township families are eligible to visit the Pantry to receive perishable and non-perishable food items and grocery store cards. The Pantry is sustained entirely by residents, civic organizations, schools, businesses and the faith community which generously donate food items, grocery store cards and cash.

San Lucas United Church of Christ is committed in the struggle for justice, peace, and the liberation of all people. We identify with the needs of an oppressed people that are in search of freedom and stand in solidarity with the struggle of the poor. Our motto is "*Faith In Action*". Hot meals are provided every Tuesday, The Food Pantry provides community residents with groceries twice a month and the Produce Mobile Program provides fresh fruits and vegetables once every month.
