

Advent, or "coming" is derived from Latin word for adventus, which was translated from the Greek word parousia for the Second Coming of Christ. The Season of Advent, the first season in the church's liturgical calendar, begins four Sundays before Christmas Day. Advent anticipates the coming of Christ from two perspectives: sharing in the ancient longing for the coming of the Messiah, and being alert for his Second Coming. The origin of Advent can be traced back to the 4th Century when it was to be a period of preparation for Epiphany, commemorating the visit of the Wise Men to baby Jesus. However, by the 6th Century it became associated initially with awaiting the Second Coming of Christ, and later also with anticipating Christ's birth. Until the past 18th Century, Advent was generally regarded as a period of making oneself ready spiritually for Christ's coming through prayer, fasting, and repentance. However, Advent for most Christians has since become a time to be in the festive and giving spirit of Christmas, and for many to attend church services to hear Biblical stories and sacred music announcing the upcoming arrival of the Christ child.

When you read this article, two of the five candles in the Advent wreath on a beautiful new stand in our Sanctuary, and in an Advent wreath you may have in your home, will not yet have been lit. The four candles in the wreath itself symbolize hope, peace, love, and joy. The hope candle is lit at the beginning of our Community Worship Service on the first Sunday in Advent - and so on for the peace, love, and joy candles on each of the following three Advent Sundays. The hope, peace and love candles are purple, the color of the Advent season. The joy candle is pink in the tradition of Gaudete (the word for rejoice in Latin) Sunday. And so, with the lighting of the joy candle on the last Sunday in Advent, we will be ready to light the larger white, "Christ" or "Good News" candle in the center of the wreath Christmas Eve, to symbolize God's gift to us in Jesus Christ.

Our clergy and music staff have been busy preparing the Christmas Eve worship services: the "Family Service" at 4:30 p.m., the "Christmas Eve Service" (meditative service with Holy Communion) at 7:30 p.m., and the "Festive Celebration of Christmas" at 11:00 p.m. Again this year, the 11:00 p.m. service will be preceded at 10:30 p.m. by "Music of Christmas" involving our Joyful Ringers Handbell Choir, Chancel Choir, a string quartet, and our congregation.

Our thanks go to all who will be making the Sanctuary so beautiful and Christmas worship so wonderful for our celebration of Christmas.

And may I wish each of you a most joyous Christmas.



Our newly-appointed choir director Stephen Blackwelder has made his way through a busy fall choir season at GCC and successfully completed his first Pageant performances. "The gifts of talent-- of dance, music, narration and all kinds of theatre craft-- in this congregation are overwhelming," Blackwelder relates. With the mounting of a new holiday event at GCC, he hopes to share with the congregation (and the greater Glenview community) one of his "personal favorite" musical and spiritual experiences, the "Do-It-Yourself" Messiah, which will occur on Saturday, December 22 at 7:30 PM.

Stephen's connection with Handel's "Messiah" goes back to his early childhood. "Like so many American musicians, it is probably the single piece of music that first riveted me as a youngster. I first experienced the power of really good music in a small parish church -- in my case it was in the late 1960s in my hometown," Blackwelder recalled. "The work was Handel's "Messiah," and the small volunteer choir was well-trained and assisted by a professional string ensemble and vocal soloists. It quite literally opened a larger world to me, both musically and spiritually."

For this event, our own Chancel Choir, soloists, church instrumentalists and attendees will be accompanied by the Waukegan Symphony Orchestra, of which Blackwelder has been the Music Director since 2000. When Stephen began his work at GCC this fall, it was a natural idea to bring these two north suburban musical groups together.

The "Do-It-Yourself" idea was born at a small church in rural England more than 30 years ago. It was first staged in Chicago in 1976 by the International Music Foundation. The concept spread to many English-speaking countries across the globe and provides choral singers a chance to join their voices in an "instant chorus" of hundreds-- in most cases, accompanied with full orchestra.

Blackwelder has hosted and directed numerous performances of Messiah in both concert and "Do-It-Yourself" formats. He adds, "You don't even have to sing--- just come and enjoy being a part of this special community. We invite you to take a break from your present wrapping and last minute holiday shopping to join us in singing and sharing the grandeur and true meaning of Christmas."
